





agr.	Subject-verb agreement	<i>E.g., The nature of the charges are serious.</i>
awk.	Awkward construction/tortured syntax.	
BB	Bluebook (19th ed.)	
comp.	Faulty or imprecise comparison	<i>E.g., Similar to <u>Smith</u>, our client acted reasonably. See JW § 6.1.5.</i>
CS	Comma splice	<i>E.g., The police officer's report was straightforward, on the other hand, it was full of conclusory statements.</i>
DM	Dangling modifier	<i>E.g., Focusing on the suspect's demeanor, the physical evidence was not noticed.</i>
expl.	Expletive construction	<i>E.g., It is our client's testimony that (instead of Our client testified that)</i>
frag.	Sentence fragment	<i>E.g., The witness at the scene who has yet to be interviewed.</i>
JW	Enquist, <i>Just Writing</i> (3d ed.)	
MM	Misplaced modifier	<i>E.g., He placed the stolen emerald in his car, which was one of the most expensive in the world.</i>
nom.	Nominalization	<i>E.g., take action, make a statement, interpose an objection, draw conclusions, (instead of act, state, object, conclude).</i>
¶	Begin a new paragraph [or use paragraph symbol]	
par[allelism]	Parallel structure lacking	<i>E.g., The witness displayed his bias through his statements and perjuring himself.</i>
PV	Unnecessary passive voice	<i>E.g., The memorandum was written by the student.</i>
repet.	Repetitive	
sp.	Spelling error	
SS	Text should be <u>single spaced</u> .	
#	Space [between characters in a citation or in a line of text]	
WC	Word choice	
wordy	Express the idea more concisely, without surplus words or information.

	Change to upper or to lower case
